



# The Ten Commandments, The Laws Governing Man's Duty To Others (Part 9):

**Commandment Nine** Concerns Man's Word and Character—Never Lie, Exodus 20:16

#### The Ninth Commandment Against False Testimony

"Lo taaneh vereakha ed shaker" (<u>Exodus 20:16</u>) "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor."

This is the great concern of the ninth commandment, the concern for truth, that we build our lives upon truth: build our families, friendships, businesses, clubs, schools, churches, communities, and governments upon truth. *Commandment Nine Concerns Man's Word and Character: Never Lie*, Exodus 20:16.

### 1. (<u>Exodus 20:16</u>) <u>Commandments, The Ten— Lying— Obedience</u>: Who is to obey this commandment?

Some commentators say that this commandment was initially given to govern testimony in legal courts, to make absolutely sure that no one ever lied or gave a false testimony in court.

There is no question this commandment does govern a person who gives evidence in court: his testimony must always be true. **But the commandment is much broader than this:** it covers far more than just legal testimony. God is declaring that no person is ever to lie against a neighbor, not on any occasion. We must never bear a false witness *against* a neighbor, and we must never bear false witness *to* a neighbor. We must always tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

**Ephesians 4:25 (NASB)** 

- <sup>25</sup>"Therefore, <u>laying aside falsehood</u>, SPEAK TRUTH EACH ONE *of you* WITH HIS NEIGHBOR, for we are members of one another." Colossians 3:9 (NASB)
- <sup>9</sup> "Do not lie to one another, since you laid aside the old self with its *evil* practices."

**Exodus 20:16 (NASB)** 

- 16 "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."Exodus 23:1 (NASB)
- 1"You shall not bear a false report; do not join your hand with a wicked man to be a malicious witness."

Was this commandment given to govern only the ancient Israelites, only those who lived before Christ came? Was lying a problem only for the ancient world? Or, is lying still a serious problem? The answer is obvious. This commandment is needed today as much as it was needed by the ancient world. God's concern for righteousness upon the earth is as strong today as it has ever been. "You shall not bear false witness: you shall never lie"—this commandment was given to you. You are not to lie, not ever.

#### **Proverbs 6:16-19 (NASB)**

- <sup>16</sup> "There are six things which the LORD hates, Yes, seven which are an abomination to Him:
- <sup>17</sup> Haughty eyes, a lying tongue, And hands that shed innocent blood,
- 18 A heart that devises wicked plans, Feet that run rapidly to evil,
- <sup>19</sup> A false witness who utters lies, And one who spreads strife among brothers."

**Matthew 12:36-37 (NASB)** 

<sup>36</sup> "But I tell you that <u>every careless word</u> that people speak, they shall give an accounting for it in the day of judgment.

<sup>37</sup> For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."
