1. Course Description

A study of the persons of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit and their unified teaching of the doctrines of the Bible.

2. Objectives

By the end of this course, students will.....

- 1. Be able to articulate a reformed understanding of the doctrines of the Bible, identifying key Scriptural passages which support these doctrines as well as passages that are difficult for the reformed understanding.
- 2. Be able to interact respectfully and knowledgably with those hold different views on these doctrines.
- 3. Be able to identify key areas of contemporary Christian life which are impacted by these doctrines.
- 4. More deeply understand and appreciate the special covenant character of their relationship with Jesus Christ.

3. Themes & Keywords

The student will become conversant with the doctrine of sin and the doctrine of salvation and be able to both teach the subject matter in the classroom as well being able to share these truths at the level of evangelism and discipleship training.

The Doctrine of the Bible: Personal Sins, Sin Nature, Imputed Sin, Backsliding, Leaven, Apostasy, Pollution by Sin, Penalty of Sin, Flesh, Gospel, Salvation, Reconciliation, Propitiation, Redemption, Substitutionary Death, Predestination, Foreknowledge, Conversion, Repentance, Saving Faith, Justification, Forgiveness of Sins, Regeneration, Adoption, Union with Christ, Assurance, The Security of the Believer, Separation, Priesthood of Believers, Liberty and Responsibility, Prayer, Fasting, Infant Salvation, and Dedication to the Will of God (Many more).

4. Texts
