Introduction to Doctrinal Footnotes

These theological footnotes are divided into three sections (1) explanation, (2) illustration, and (3) application. When you have absorbed all the notes within one topic area, you will have completed a total survey of that doctrine.

I-The Doctrine of Sins

8-Penalty of Sin

Rom. 6:23

Romans 6:23 (NASB)

²³ "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Explanation: The *penalty of sin* is death, both spiritual and physical. The moment Adam sinned he died spiritually; in that sense, everyone is born dead in sin (Eph. 2:1).

Ephesians 2:1 (NASB)

1"And you were dead in your trespasses and sins."

Physical death, described as the separation of the body and spirit (<u>James 2:26</u>), is the ultimate result of sin (<u>Gen. 3</u>).



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James 2:26 (NASB)

²⁶ "For just as the body without *the* spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead."

People who die in their sin (in an unsaved state) will have to face a "second death" portrayed as a "lake of fire" (Rev. 20:15).

Revelation 20:15 (NASB)

¹⁵ "And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire."

Application: The only escape from this second death is to receive the gift of eternal life in the person of the Lord Jesus Christ.

9-Flesh Rom. 8:13

Romans 8:13 (NASB)

¹³ "For if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

Explanation: The Scriptures use the word flesh in five ways. It may refer to:

- 1) the body or physical being;
- 2) the old nature or sin nature;
- 3) the epidermis (skin);
- 4) man's immaterial nature; or
- 5) the whole being of man.

Paul uses the term in each of these verses in this chapter. Flesh itself is not evil (<u>Job</u> <u>19:26</u>), yet Paul uses it to represent humanity's evil nature, which cannot please God (<u>v.8</u>).

Job 19:26 (NASB)

²⁶ "Even after my skin is destroyed, Yet from my flesh I shall see God." Romans 8:8 (NASB)

<u>Application</u>: Christians should glorify God in their physical bodies (flesh) as well as in their spirits, since both belong to God (1Cor. 6:20).

1 Corinthians 6:20 (NASB)

²⁰ "For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."

^{8 &}quot;And those who are in the flesh cannot please God."
