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VII-Doctrine of Salvation

22-Prayer <u>Matt. 7:7</u>

Matthew 7:7 (NASB)

⁷ Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.

Explanation: Both *Jesus* (Luke 18:1) and *Paul* (1 Timothy 2:1) emphasized the importance of prayer, noting that people ought always to pray.

Luke 18:1 (NASB)

¹ Now He was telling them a parable to show that at all times they ought to pray and not to lose heart,

1 Timothy 2:1 (NASB)

¹ First of all, then, I urge that entreaties *and* prayers, petitions *and* thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men,

Prayer includes asking and getting answers from God. But it is more than just asking; it is confession, adoration, thanksgiving, and fellowship with God. By its nature, prayer is talking to God. It is the basis of the successful Christian life, and is so important that not praying is considered a sin (1 Samuel 12:23).

1 Samuel 12:23 (NASB)

²³ Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by ceasing to pray for you; but I will instruct you in the good and right way.

When we pray, we should follow the model prayer Jesus gave His disciples and address it to our heavenly Father---beginning with adoration, including thanksgiving and confession of sins, making reconciliation with others, praying for our needs and the needs of others, and concluding in Jesus' name (Matthew 6:9-15; John 14:14).

Matthew 6:9-15 (NASB)

- ⁹ Pray, then, in this way: 'Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.
- ¹⁰ Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven.
- ¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread.
- ¹² And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
- ¹³ And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.']
- ¹⁴ For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.
- $^{15}\,\mathrm{But}$ if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.

John 14:14 (NASB)

¹⁴ If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it.

<u>Illustration:</u> Jesus pointed out that God heard the prayer of a humble publican rather than that of a proud Pharisee (<u>Luke 18:14</u>).

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Luke 18:14 (NASB)

¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Application: God will answer our prayer when we:

1) obey Him (1 John 3:22),

1 John 3:22 (NASB)

And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do the things that are pleasing in His sight.

2) confess sin (<u>Psalm 66:18</u>),

Psalm 66:18 (NASB)

¹⁸ If I regard wickedness in my heart, The Lord will not hear;

3) abide in Christ (John 15:7),

John 15:7 (NASB)

⁷ If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.

4) ask according to the will of God (1 John 5:14),

1 John 5:14 (NASB)

¹⁴ This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

5) ask in faith (Mark 11:24),

Mark 11:24 (NASB)

²⁴ Therefore I say to you, all things for which you pray and ask, believe that you have received them, and they will be *granted* you.

6) have pure motives (James 4:3), and

James 4:3 (NASB)

³ You ask and do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, so that you may spend *it* on your pleasures.

7) live peaceably with our mate (1 Peter 3:7).

1 Peter 3:7 (NASB)

⁷ You husbands in the same way, live with *your wives* in an understanding way, as with someone weaker, since she is a woman; and show her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered.
