# **The Resurrections (15)** What Happens to Christians Who Die?

## The Doctrine of the Resurrections

(1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

The Thessalonians' ignorance about the Rapture caused them to grieve.

It was to give them hope and to comfort them that Paul discussed that momentous event, giving a **fourfold description of it: 1**) its pillars, 2) participants, 3) plan, and 4) profit (the benefits).

## 1. The Pillars of the Rapture

The marvelous truth that the Lord Jesus Christ will return to gather believers to Himself is <u>based on three unshakeable pillars</u>: 1) the death of Christ, 2) the resurrection of Christ, and 3) the revelation of Christ.

1. The death of Christ

2. The Resurrection of Christ

The view that the <u>raptured saints</u> return to earth with Christ also contradicts <u>John</u> <u>14:1-3</u>:

#### John 14:1-3 (NASB)

<sup>1</sup> "Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me.

<sup>2</sup> "In <u>My Father's house</u> are many dwelling places; if it were not so, I would have told you; for I go to prepare a place for you.

<sup>3</sup> "If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that <u>where I am</u>, *there* you may be also.

The phrases "<u>My Father's house</u>" and "<u>where I am</u>" clearly refer to heaven (cf. John 7:34).

### John 7:34 (NASB)

<sup>34</sup> "You will seek Me, and will not find Me; and <u>where I am</u>, you cannot come."

Jesus promised to take believers back to heaven with Him when He returns to gather His people. There has to be a time interval, then, between Christ's return to gather His people (**the Rapture**) and His return to earth to establish the millennial kingdom (**the Second Coming**).

#### 07-18-10 Series: The Resurrections

During that interval between the **Rapture** and the **Second Coming**, the believers' judgment takes place (<u>1 Corinthians 3:11-15</u>; <u>2 Corinthians 5:10</u>); a **post-tribulational Rapture** would leave no time for that event.

1 Corinthians 3:11-15 (NASB)

<sup>11</sup> For no man can lay a foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

<sup>12</sup> Now if any man builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw,

<sup>13</sup> each man's work will become evident; for the day will show it because it is *to be* revealed with fire, and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work.

<sup>14</sup> If any man's work which he has built on it remains, he will receive a reward.

<sup>15</sup> If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.

2 Corinthians 5:10 (NASB)

<sup>10</sup> For <u>we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ</u>, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.

1 Thessalonians 4:14b (NASB)

<sup>14</sup> For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who have fallen <u>asleep in Jesus</u>.

The phrase **in Jesus** is best understood as describing the circumstances in which the departed saints fell **asleep**. They died in the condition of *being related* to Jesus Christ. Paul used essentially the same phrase in <u>1 Corinthians 15:18</u> when he wrote of those "who have fallen asleep in Christ."

By demonstrating God's acceptance of His atoning sacrifice, the resurrection of Christ buttresses **the first pillar on which the Rapture is based**, the death of Christ.

Now let's remember what we have been talking about.

1 Thessalonians 4:13 (NASB)

<sup>13</sup> But we do not want you to be uninformed, brethren, about those who are asleep, <u>so that you will not grieve as do the rest who have no hope</u>.

It was to give them hope and to comfort them that Paul discussed that momentous event, giving a fourfold description of it: 1) its pillars, 2) participants, 3) plan, and 4) (benefits) profits.
