B. The Motives for Giving Generously and Sacrificially, <u>2 Corinthians 9:8-15</u>

The Path to Prosperity (2 Corinthians 9:6-15)

2 Corinthians 9:6-15 (NASB)

⁶Now this *I say*, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.

⁷ Each one *must do* just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed;

⁹ as it is written, "HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE TO THE POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES FOREVER."

¹⁰ Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness;

¹¹ you will be enriched in everything for all liberality, which through us is producing thanksgiving to God.

¹² For the ministry of this service is not only fully supplying the needs of the saints, but is also overflowing through many thanksgivings to God.

¹³ Because of the proof given by this ministry, they will glorify God for *your* obedience to your confession of the gospel of Christ and for the liberality of your contribution to them and to all,

¹⁴ while they also, by prayer on your behalf, yearn for you because of the surpassing grace of God in you.

¹⁵ Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!"

To motivate the Corinthians to give, Paul gave a <u>fivefold description</u> of the harvest that would result: 1) <u>love from God</u>, 2) <u>generosity from God</u>, 3) <u>glory to God</u>, 4) <u>friends from God</u>, and 5) <u>likeness to God</u>.

1) Love from God

2 Corinthians 9:7 (NASB)

⁷ "<u>Each one</u> must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a <u>cheerful giver</u>."

It is hard to imagine a more precious promise than to be the personal object of God's love. All the world's acclaim, honor, and rewards given to all philanthropists put together does not come close to this privilege of being loved by God. Yet that is what He promises the <u>cheerful giver</u>. God loves the world in a general sense (John 3:16), but He has a deeper, more wonderful love for His own (John 13:1; 1 John 4:16), and a special love for <u>each one</u> of His who gives cheerfully.

John 3:16 (NASB)

¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." John 13:1 (NASB)

¹ "Now before the Feast of the Passover, Jesus knowing that His hour had come that He would depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end." 1 John 4:16 (NASB)

¹⁶ "We have come to know and have believed the love which God has for us. God is love, and the one who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him."

<u>Cheerful</u> giving comes from inside, from the heart, rather than from external coercion. It begins by giving **just as** one **has purposed in his heart**. Once again, Paul stressed the truth that Christian giving is strictly voluntary (see the previous discussion of **<u>2 Corinthians 8:3</u>** in this teaching). But though it is not forced, neither is it **<u>casual</u>**, **<u>careless</u>**, or a **<u>mere afterthought</u>**. *Proaireo* (**purposed**), used only here in the New Testament, has the idea of predetermination. Though there is spontaneous joy in giving, it is still to be planned and systematic (<u>**1 Corinthians 16:2**</u>), not impulsive and sporadic.

1 Corinthians 16:2 (NASB)

² "On the first day of every week each one of you is to put aside and save, as he may prosper, so that no collections be made when I come."

2 Corinthians 9:7 (NASB) ⁷ "Each one *must do* just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or <u>under compulsion</u>, for God loves <u>a</u> <u>cheerful giver</u>."

Nor is giving to be done <u>grudgingly</u>. *Lupē* (grudgingly) literally *means*, "sorrow," "grief," or "pain." Giving is not to be done with an attitude of <u>remorse</u>, <u>regret</u>, or <u>reluctance</u>, of mourning over parting with what is given. And, as noted above, it is not to be <u>under compulsion</u> from any legalistic external pressure.

The giving that God approves of comes from <u>a cheerful giver</u>. <u>Cheerful</u> translates *hilaros*, from which the English word *hilarious* derives. Happy, joyous givers, who are joyous in view of the privilege of giving, are the special objects of God's love.

2) Generosity from God

2 Corinthians 9:8-11a (NASB)

⁸ And God is able to make <u>all</u> grace abound to you, so that always having <u>all</u> sufficiency in <u>everything</u>, you may have an <u>abundance</u> for <u>every</u> good deed;

While it is possible to give without loving, *it is not possible to love without giving*. God gives His Son to all believers, but as previously noted, He blesses in a unique way the generous, cheerful giver. In fact, He blesses such believers on such a grand, immense, staggering scale that it beggars language to express it. Trying to convey the magnanimity of God's generosity, Paul resorted to hyperbole, using a form of the word *pas* (all) five times in <u>verse 8</u>. God's gracious giving has no limits; it is off the scale.

2 Corinthians 9:8 (NASB)

⁸ "And God <u>is able</u> to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed."

Since giving naturally seems to result in having less, not more, it takes faith to believe that giving will open up God's blessing. Christians must believe that what God has promised to do He <u>is able</u> to do. *Dunateō* (is able) literally means "has power." God's power is great (<u>Deuteronomy 4:37; Deuteronomy 9:29; Nehemiah 1:10; Psalm 66:3;</u> Psalm 79:11; Jeremiah 32:17; Nahum 1:3; Revelation 11:17) and is exhibited in creation, providence, miracles, salvation, the resurrections of Jesus Christ and believers, and in the eternal destruction of the wicked in hell.

Deuteronomy 4:37 (NASB)

³⁷ "Because He loved your fathers, therefore He chose their descendants after them. And He personally brought you from Egypt by His great <u>power</u>."

Deuteronomy 9:29 (NASB)

Not surprisingly, then, Paul expressed his concern "that [the Corinthians'] faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God" (<u>1 Corinthians 2:5</u> NASB).

2 Corinthians 9:8 (NASB)

⁸ "And God <u>is able</u> to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed."

Human wisdom teaches that prosperity comes from grasping for wealth, not from giving it away. But faith trusts in God's promise to bless the giver and in His ability to keep His promises, knowing that He is able to:

Ephesians 3:20 (NASB)

²⁰ "Now to Him who is able to <u>do far more abundantly beyond all that</u> [believers] we ask or think, according to the power that works within us."

But faith trusts in God's promise to bless the giver and in His ability to keep His promises, knowing that He is able to: **guard and preserve them** (2 Tim. 1:12; Heb. 7:25; Jude 24).

2 Timothy 1:12 (NASB)

¹² "For this reason I also suffer these things, but I am not ashamed; for I know whom I have believed and I am convinced that <u>He is able</u> to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day."

Hebrews 7:25 (NASB)

²⁵ "Therefore <u>He is able also to save forever</u> those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them."

But faith trusts in God's promise to bless the giver and in His ability to keep His promises, knowing that He is able to: <u>help them when they are tempted</u> (<u>Heb. 2:18</u>), <u>Hebrews 2:18 (NASB)</u>

¹⁸ "For since He Himself was tempted in that which He has suffered, He is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted."

But faith trusts in God's promise to bless the giver and in His ability to keep His promises, knowing that He is able to: and raise them from the dead (Heb. 11:19).

Hebrews 11:19 (NASB)

¹⁹ "He considered that <u>God is able to raise *people* even from the dead</u>, from which he also received him back as a type."

Believers, like Abraham, must be **"fully assured that what God [has] promised, He** [is] able also to perform" (Romans 4:21 NASB).

2 Corinthians 9:8 (NASB)

⁸ "And God is able to <u>make all grace abound</u> to you, so that <u>always</u> having <u>all sufficiency in everything</u>, you may have <u>an abundance for</u> <u>every good deed</u>."

God gives back magnanimously so as to **make all grace abound** to Christians who give generously. He gives so freely and abundantly that His children will **always** have **all sufficiency in everything**. In this context, that refers primarily to material resources, because the harvest must be of the same nature as the seed. Having sown material wealth by their giving, believers will reap an abundant harvest of material blessing in return. God graciously replenishes what they give so that they lack nothing; He will continuously provide the generous giver with the means of further expressing that generosity.

To the Cynic and Stoic philosophers of Paul's day *autarkeia* (sufficiency) meant independence from people and circumstances. They viewed such independence as essential to true happiness. But the believer's sufficiency does not come from independence from circumstances but rather from dependence on God. As Paul wrote to the Philippians, "My God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19 NASB).

The reason God gives back to those who give is not, as prosperity teachers falsely imply and exemplify, so people can consume it on their own desires with bigger cars, homes, and jewels. God supplies them so they will have <u>an abundance for every good</u> <u>deed</u>. The Lord will fully supply cheerful givers with what they need to use for what is good work to the honor of the Lord. He constantly replenishes what they expend so the

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cycle of giving and ministering to others can continue. Generous givers are the people whose lives are most full of righteous deeds.

2 Corinthians 9:9 (NASB) ⁹ "<u>As it is written</u>, "<u>HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE</u> <u>TO THE POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES</u> <u>FOREVER</u>."

Lest anyone think this was some radical new social welfare plan he had concocted, Paul cited **Psalm 112:9** to show this has always been God's plan.

Psalm 112:9 (NASB)

⁹ "<u>He has given freely to the poor, His righteousness endures forever</u>; His horn will be exalted in honor."

The phrase <u>as it is written</u> is the standard New Testament way of introducing an Old Testament quote (<u>Mark 1:2; Mark 7:6; Luke 2:23; Luke 3:4; John 6:31; John 12:14-</u> <u>15; Acts 7:42; Acts 15:15-17; Romans 1:17; Romans 2:24; Romans 3:4, 10; Romans 4:17; Romans 8:36; Romans 9:13, 33; Romans 10:15; Romans 11:8, 26; Romans 15:3, 9, 21; 1 Corinthians 1:31; 1 Corinthians 2:9; 1 Corinthians 10:7).</u>

⁹ "And for the Gentiles to glorify God for His mercy; <u>as it is written</u>, 'THEREFORE I WILL GIVE PRAISE TO YOU AMONG THE GENTILES, AND I WILL SING TO YOUR NAME.""

Exodus 32:19 (NASB)

⁹ "As it is written, "<u>HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE TO THE</u> POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES FOREVER."

Because the generous giver scatter[s] abroad and gives to the poor, his righteousness endures forever. God will replenish and reward him both in time and eternity.

Deuteronomy 15:10-11 also illustrates this point. In <u>verse 10</u> God declared through Moses,

Deuteronomy 15:10 (NASB)

¹⁰ "You shall generously give to him, and your heart shall not be grieved when you give to him, because for this thing the LORD your God will bless you in all your work and in all your undertakings.

Those who were generous to the needy received God's material blessings. But the purpose was not so that they could be like the rich fool in Jesus' parable, who said, "¹⁸This is what I will do: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years to come; take your ease, eat, drink and be merry'" (Luke 12:18-19 NASB).

<u>Verse 11</u> reveals the purpose of God's blessing. Moses reminded his hearers that: Deuteronomy 15:11 (NASB)

¹¹ "For the poor will never cease *to be* in the land; therefore I command you, saying, 'You shall freely open your hand to your brother, to your needy and poor in your land.""

God's constant resupply allowed them to continually give to meet the needs of others.

2 Corinthians 9:10 (NASB) ¹⁰ "Now <u>He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will</u> <u>supply and multiply</u> your <u>seed for sowing</u> and increase the harvest of your righteousness."

Paul reinforced his point with a third Old Testament quote, this one from <u>Isaiah</u> <u>55:10</u>. That generous giving will impoverish no one is evident since <u>He who supplies</u> <u>seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply</u> their <u>seed for sowing</u>.

Isaiah 55:10 (NASB)

¹⁰ "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, And do not return there without watering the earth And making it bear and sprout, And furnishing <u>seed to the sower</u> and bread to the eater."

God is the One <u>who supplies seed to the sower</u> because He created all the earth's vegetation (<u>Genesis 1:11-12</u>).

Genesis 1:11-12 (NASB)

¹¹ "Then God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, *and* fruit trees on the earth bearing fruit after their kind with seed in them"; and it was so.

¹² The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good."

2 Corinthians 9:10 (NASB)

¹⁰ "Now He who supplies seed to the sower and <u>bread for food</u> will supply and multiply your <u>seed for sowing</u> and increase the harvest of your righteousness."

Thus, He provides the grain that provides **bread for food**. The same God who provides seed for the harvest in the natural world will **multiply** generous givers' **seed for sowing**. They sow the seed and then reap the harvest, which in turn provides more seed for sowing in an ever-expanding cycle. The ultimate harvest of generous giving is not only eternal reward, but also temporal blessing in this life for those who "**sow with a view to righteousness**, [and] reap in accordance with kindness" (Hosea 10:12).

Hosea 10:12 (NASB) ¹² "Sow with a view to righteousness, Reap in accordance with kindness; Break up your fallow ground, For it is time to seek the LORD Until He comes to rain righteousness on you."

2 Corinthians 9:11 (NASB) ¹¹ "You will be enriched in everything for all liberality, which through us is producing thanksgiving to God."

They will be enriched in everything, equipping them for all liberality in their giving.
